

APPROVED HONEYBEE MEDICATION AND/OR TREATMENT SCHEDULE

ALL YEAR LONG

Shortening/sugar patties with NO medications may help with both Varroa and Tracheal mite control and won't harm honey



SPRING (Remove before honey flow starts)

Terramycin for American Foulbrood prevention
Fumidil-B® in sugar syrup for Nosema prevention/treatment
Apistan® strips – 2 per brood box – for control of Varroa mites (keep on hives no longer than 56 days)
Menthol crystals for control of Tracheal mites



FALL (Or earlier if you have removed your Honey Supers)

Terramycin for American Foulbrood prevention
Fumidil-B® in sugar syrup for Nosema prevention/treatment
Apistan® strips – 2 per brood box – for control of Varroa mites (keep on hives no longer than 56 days)
Menthol crystals for control of Tracheal mites

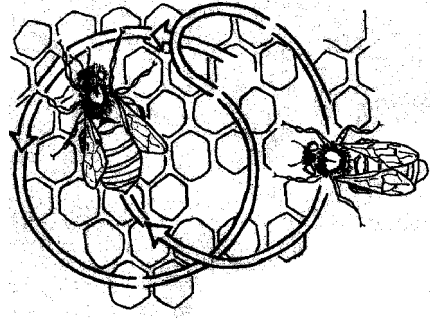
